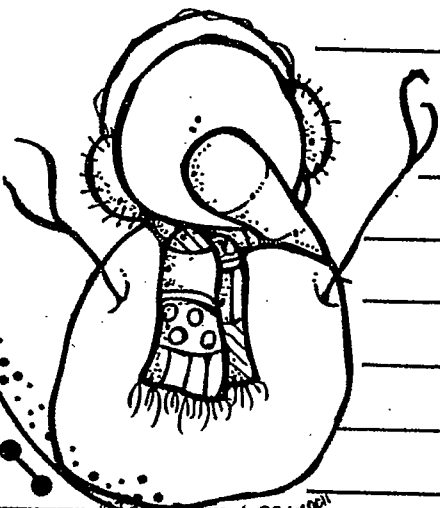

Common and Proper Nouns

Common nouns name any person, place, or thing. **Proper nouns** name a particular person, place, or thing. They begin with a capital letter. Capitalize each important word in a proper noun.

Common nouns: We will go to the city one day.

Proper nouns: We will go to Houston on Tuesday.

Singular and Plural Nouns

A **singular noun** names only one person, place, or thing. A **plural noun** names more than one. Most nouns add **-s** to form the plural: **storms**. Add **-es** to a noun that ends in **ch, sh, s, ss, or x**: **couches, ashes, buses, kisses, boxes**. When a noun ends in a consonant and **y**, change the **y** to **i** and then add **-es**: **bodies**.

Some irregular plural nouns have a special form.

A **noun** names a person, place, or thing. A **pronoun** takes the place of one or more nouns. A **singular pronoun** takes the place of a singular noun. A **plural pronoun** takes the place of a plural noun or of more than one noun. The pronoun *I* is always capitalized.
